

Understanding 4-Point Rubrics

When you submit an assignment, it is assessed according to the Sask DLC 4-point grading rubric (Grade 1-9).

The rubrics you receive with returned assignments use numbers, but these numbers are not a rating scale. Each number represents the level to which the student has demonstrated their understanding of the concept or skill. A typical (grade level) score to receive is a level 3.
